#### Jr. Marine Biologist

June 25-29 (Friday Field Trip)

Come experience life as a keeper at the zoo! Mornings will be spent assisting Zookeepers with their daily tasks in feeding, cleaning and caring for reptiles, mammals or birds. Afternoons will include discussions on Zoo careers, interactive games and projects related to animal science and the Zoo environment.

*\*Prior to camp, participants must submit results from negative TB skin test within past 12 months.*

#### Sierra Field Biology

July 30– Aug 3 (Fri Field Trip)

Discover the wonder of how animals, plants and humans are intertwined in the conservation of our majestic Sierra Nevada Mountains. Experience up-close encounters with native species, absorb the wisdom of our resident field biologist Burleigh "the Bat Lady," and put your new knowledge to use in a field expedition to explore our native forests. *\*Additional \$75 fee to cover field trip costs.*
