The Fresno Chaffee Zoo (<a href="www.fresnochaffeezoo.org">www.fresnochaffeezoo.org</a>) and California Poison Control System (<a href="http://www.calpoison.org">http://www.calpoison.org</a>) would like to remind all California residents to be aware of rattlesnakes that are waking up early from hibernation because of the warm weather. Experts say that 2016 has the potential of an abundance of snake populations as a result of heavy rains in Northern California. Female snakes are giving birth to a bumper crop of babies, and California residents should be aware and cautious; even newborn rattlesnakes possess dangerous venom.
